GOING HOME

You will be discharged from the Center when you meet discharge criteria. You will be given specific written instructions upon discharge regarding medications, pain (what to expect what to do), physical activity, driving, and diet.



Call Your Physician If:

- You have a fever over 101 degrees F (38 degrees C)
- You have excessive rectal bleeding
- You have excessive abdominal pain
- You have nausea or vomiting

THE DAY OF YOUR PROCEDURE

Preparation at Home

• Follow the specific instructions from your physician's office

Before You Leave Home

- Shower or bathe
- Wear comfortable loose fitting clothing
- Leave valuables such as: jewelry, watches, at home

What to Bring

- Photo ID
- Insurance cards, and any payments required by your insurance company
- Medication reconciliation list sent to you by your physician
- Completed health history form and sent to you by your physician
- Please bring a copy of your health Care Proxy/Advance Directives, if you have one
- You MUST have a family member/friend to stay with you at the Center and drive you home

Pre-op Preparation

- Your endodoscopist will meet with you before your procedure. You will also meet your nurses and who will be involved in your care. The risks and benefits of your procedure will be discussed, you sign a consent form and your medical history will be reviewed.
- You will receive a combination of medications that keep you comfortable during your procedure. It is given by a registered nurse physician. The registered nurse will monitor your condition and provide medication ordered by your physician.

THE PROCEDURE ROOM

The procedure room provides a safe and comfortable environment for your test. You will be taken to your procedure room on a stretcher.



Your physician leads the endoscopy team. A nurse will be with you at all times.

While you are having your procedure you will be kept comfortable and monitored continuously.

RECOVERY

After your procedure, you will be taken to the recovery area. You will be closely monitored as the sedation wears off.

• Your blood pressure, pulse, and respiration will be checked frequently. You will be asked simple questions to determine when the sedation is wearing off. You will be offered juice or water to drink before discharge.

SPECIAL CONCIDERATIONS

- It is strongly advised that someone stay with you during surgery. They may want to bring a small snack with them.
- Cameras and firearms are not permitted.
- Cell phones need to be turned off.
- Children are resticted from many areas. We advise that they stay at home.
